



The scarce fritillary is a butterfly which occurs in central and south-eastern Europe, Baltic and Scandinavia.

Overall assessment for Boreal region is 'favourable' because species was evaluated in all four parameters as 'favourable' for three countries representing majority of its distribution area (more than 98%). Unfortunately assessments are 'unfavourable-bad' for Alpine and Continental regions. For Pannonian region assessment is 'unfavourableinadequate' but with 'favourable' report from Slovakia and future prospects overall. Species is 'data deficient' according to IUCN.
