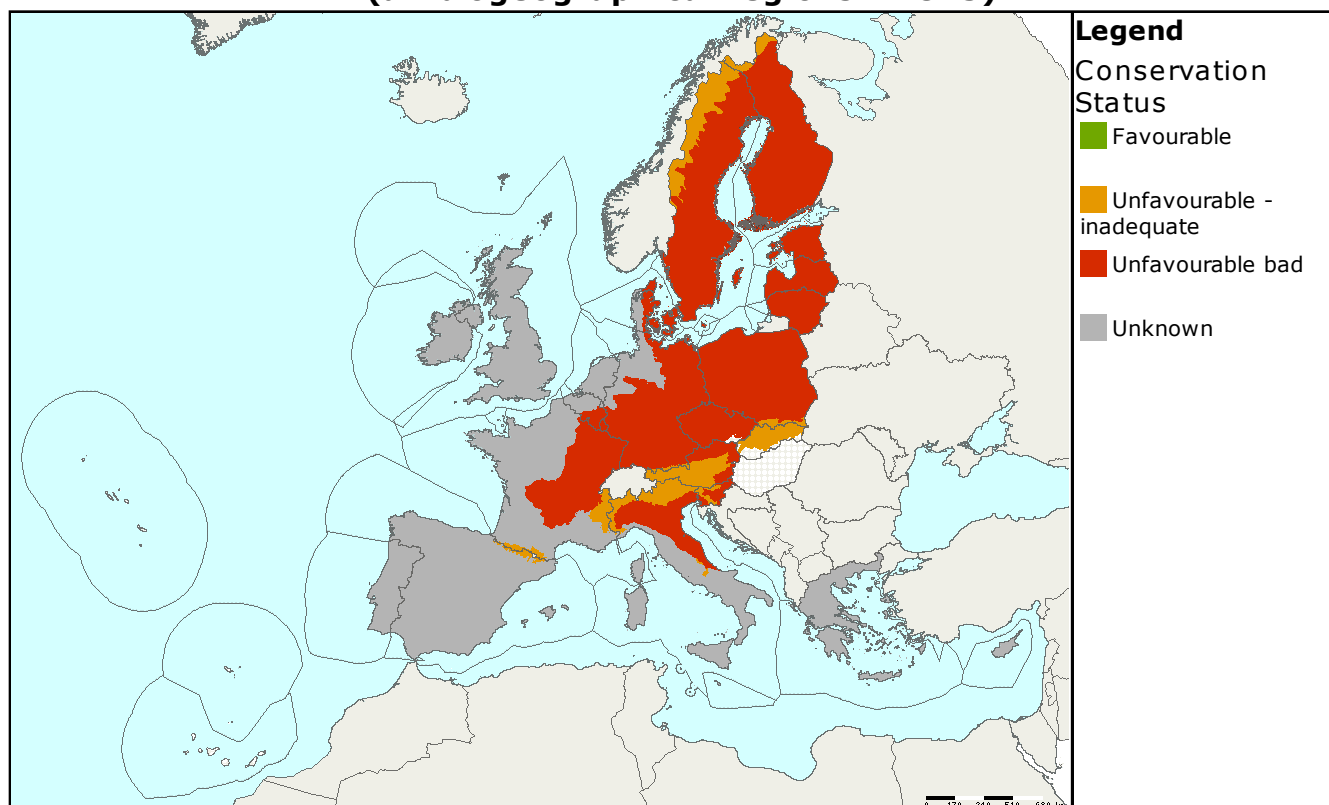

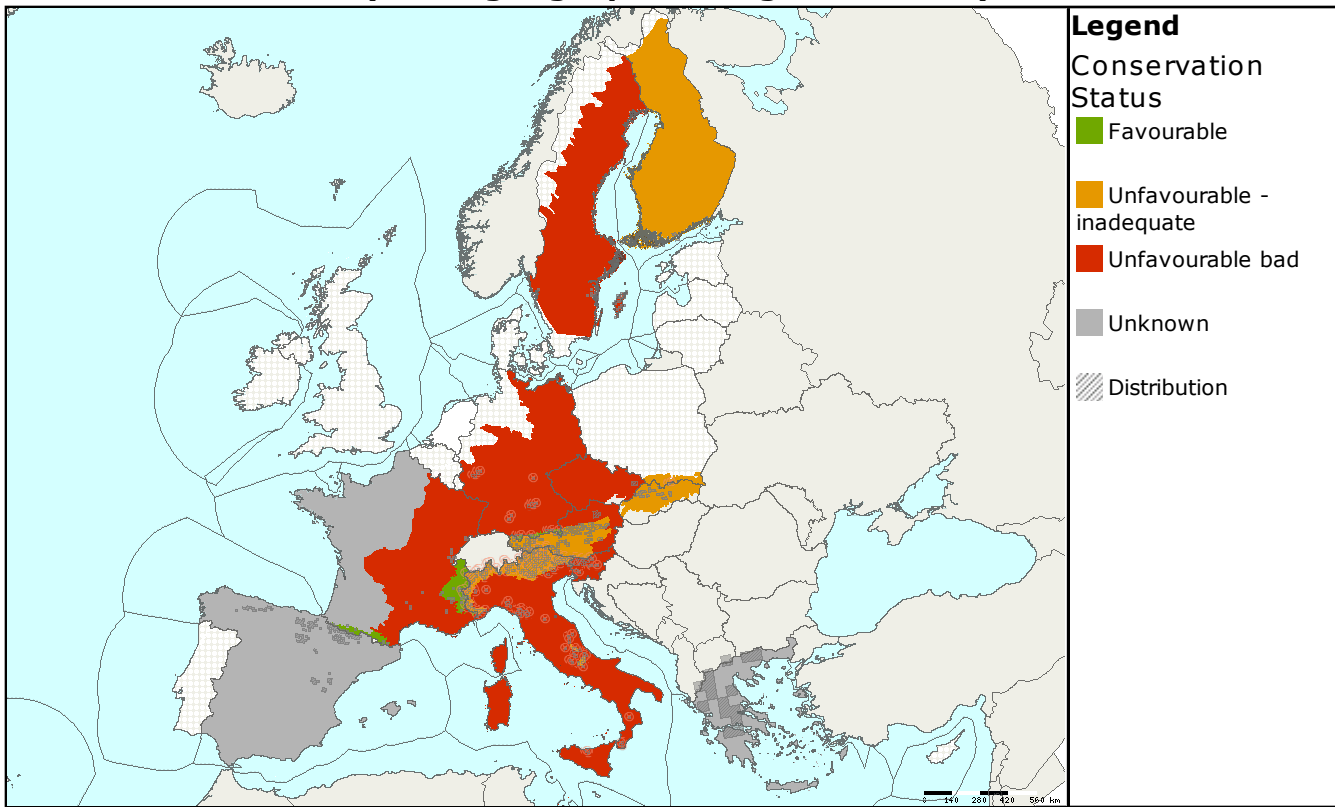

The Apollo or mountain Apollo is a butterfly which is widely spread across Europe, mainly mountainous regions. It lives and feeds on flowery meadows and pastures.

The overall status of this species is ‘unfavourable-bad’ in the Boreal and Continental region, ‘inadequate’ in the Alpine region and ‘unknown’ in the Atlantic and Mediterranean region. In particular data of Spain and mainly Greece are missing. The IUCN conservation status is ‘Vulnerable’.
