

The limpet, Patella ferruginea, is an endemic Mediterranean species. This species, formerly widespread in almost all of the western Mediterranean, is currently very rare and is considered a relic species with geographically isolated colonies. It is reported as occurring in Spain, France and Italy.

The conservation status is 'unfavourable-bad' due to the overall assessments provided by France and Italy who host more than 25% of the overall potential distribution. The above countries reported the threats to the species as being water pollution, collection and habitat degradation. More data is required for the species.
