



An euro-siberian butterfly species. Its natural range spreads from the central and the eastern Europe and Balkan, over Asia Minor to western Siberia. In EU it occurs as well in Bulgaria and Slovakia. It is considered extinct in Czech Republic. Within the European part of the range the species occurs in dry, rocky or sandy grasslands, steppes, forests fringes or light open forests.

The conservation status in the Continental biogeographical region is 'unfavourable bad'. Here the species reaches north-western margin of its natural distribution. It is extinct in several locations and remaining populations are small and isolated. In the Mediterranean biogeographical region the status is 'unknown'. In the European scale the species is considered 'endangered'.
