



The *Stylurus flavipes* is a dragonfly which is widely distributed across Europe. It has a preference for extended, naturally flowing river areas with wide river banks where it hides in bushes (mainly willows and poplars).

The status of this species in the Atlantic and Pannonian region is 'favourable', despite the 'bad' conservation status in the Czech Republic and Slovakia. The situation in some countries of the Continental region is unclear and therefore it is overall assessed as 'inadequate'. In the Boreal and Mediterranean region its status is assessed as 'unknown', since the lack of data from Estonia, Latvia and Greece. This species is sensitive for changes in river systems and removal of bushy vegetation on the river banks.
