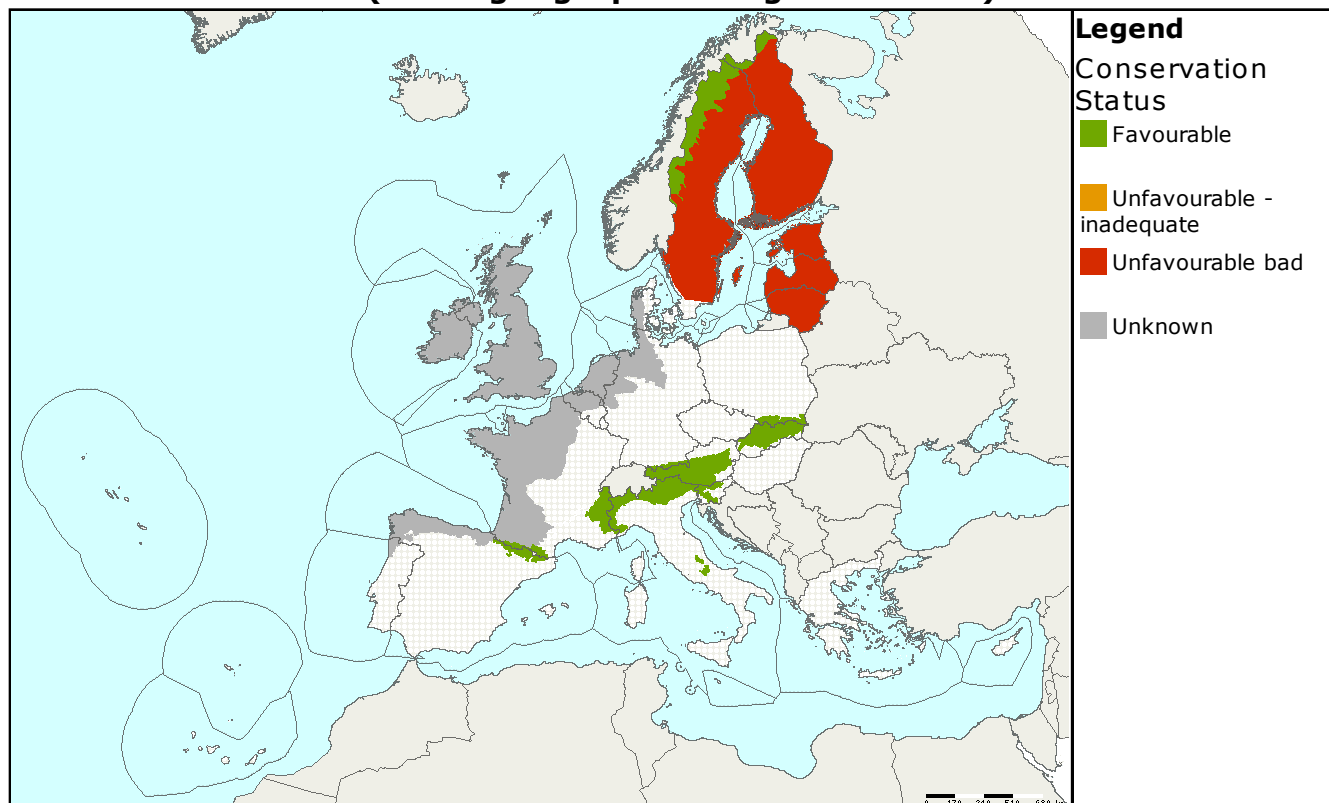

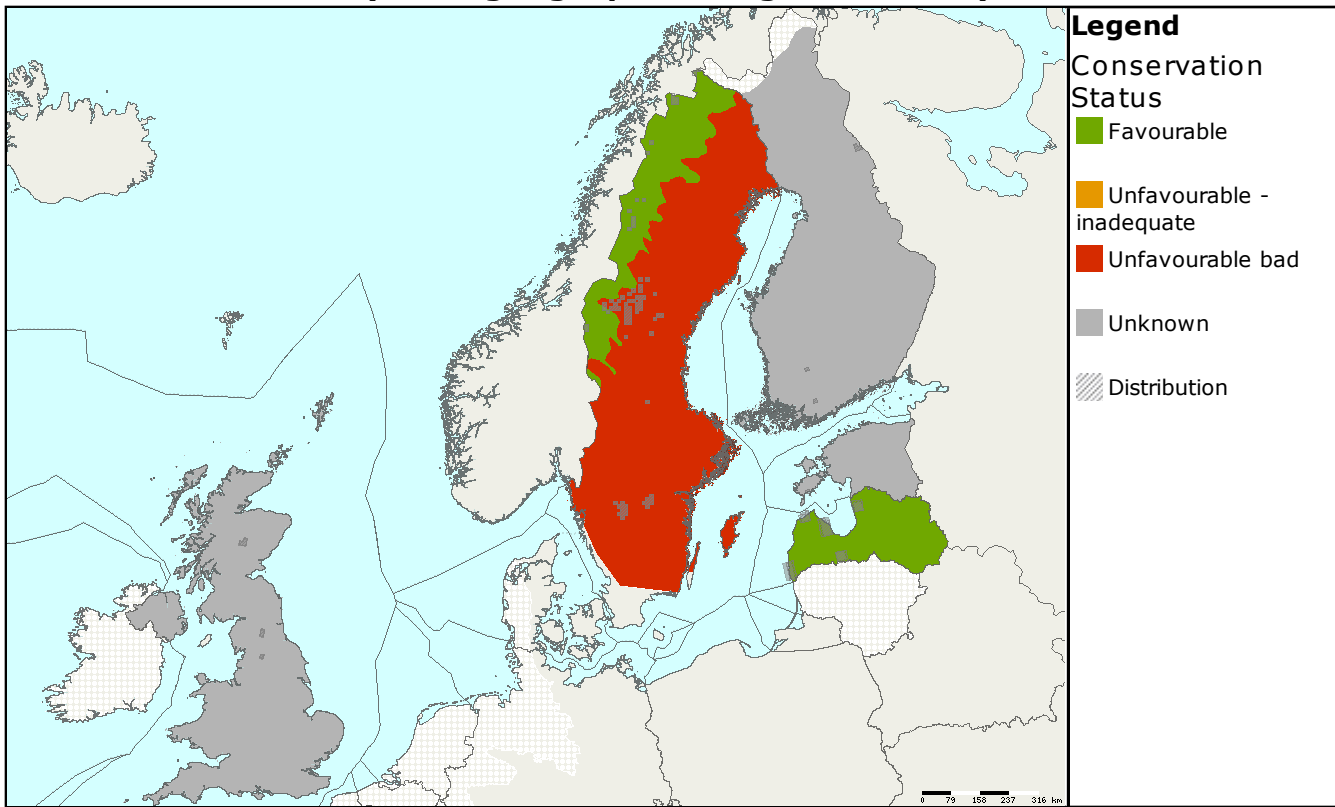

The round-mouthed whorl snail occurs in North Europe plus the United Kingdom.

The status of this species in the Alpine region was assessed as ‘favourable’, due to its status in Sweden. In the Atlantic region its status is ‘unknown’ because that is the status of this species in the United Kingdom which is the only country representing the Atlantic region. For a better assessment, more data from this country would be desirable. In the Boreal region the status of this species has been assessed as ‘bad’, which is mainly due to its status in Sweden which hosts the majority of the known localities of the species in the Boreal region. However, the largest part of the range of this species is situated in Latvia for which the status was assessed as ‘favourable’.
