



The striped dolphin is widely distributed in the tropical and warm-temperate deep waters, of the continental shelf and beyond, of the marine Atlantic, Macaronesian and Mediterranean regions. It is rare in the UK waters and frequent in the French, Spanish and Portuguese coasts including the islands of the Macaronesian region and all of the Mediterranean. The Mediterranean and North Atlantic populations appear to be isolated from each other.

Knowledge on this species is limited for almost all parameters reported by Member States and as such the overall conclusion for the marine Atlantic, Macaronesian and Mediterranean regions is 'unknown'. Though listed, at a global level, as species of 'least concern' by the IUCN Red List of threatened species it is proposed for listing as 'vulnerable' in the IUCN regional Red list for the Mediterranean Sea because of the various threats to which it is known to be exposed to (contaminants, fishery interaction etc.).
