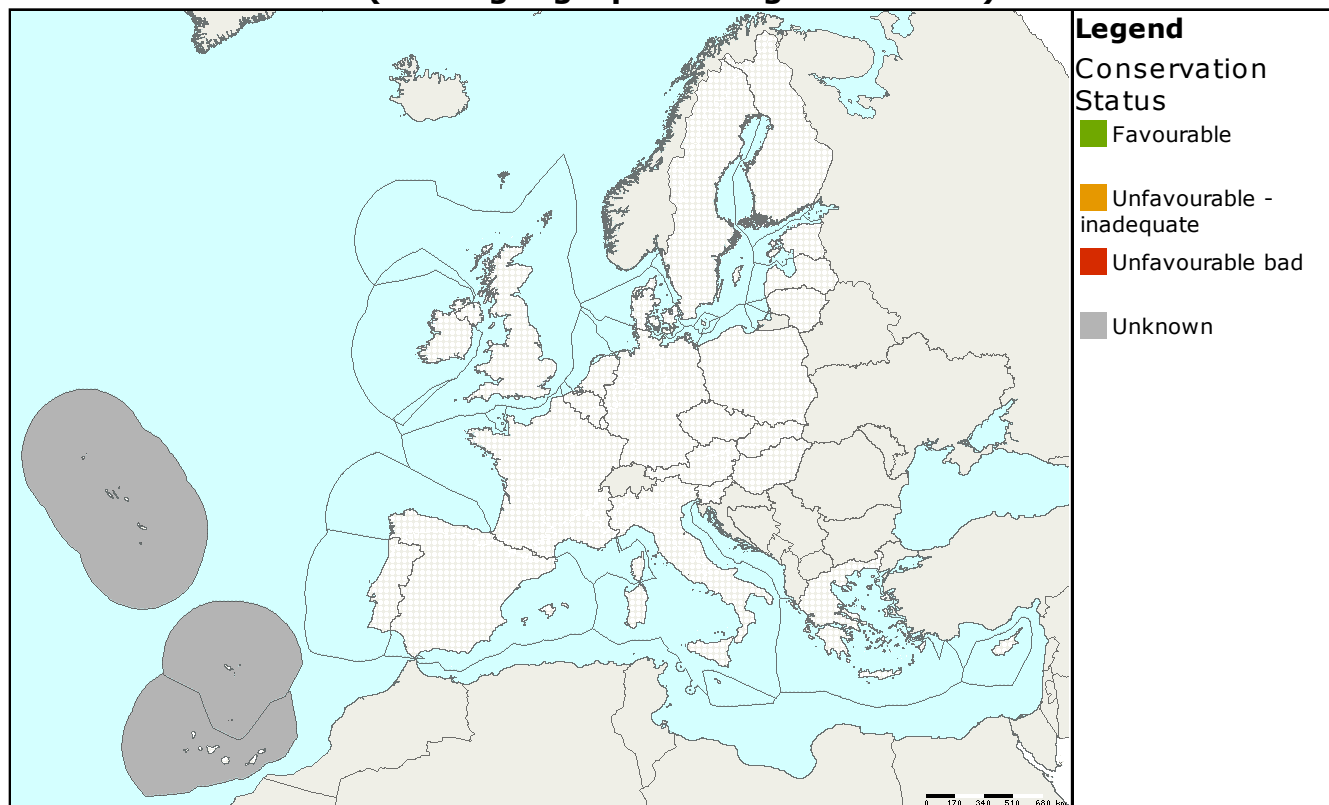

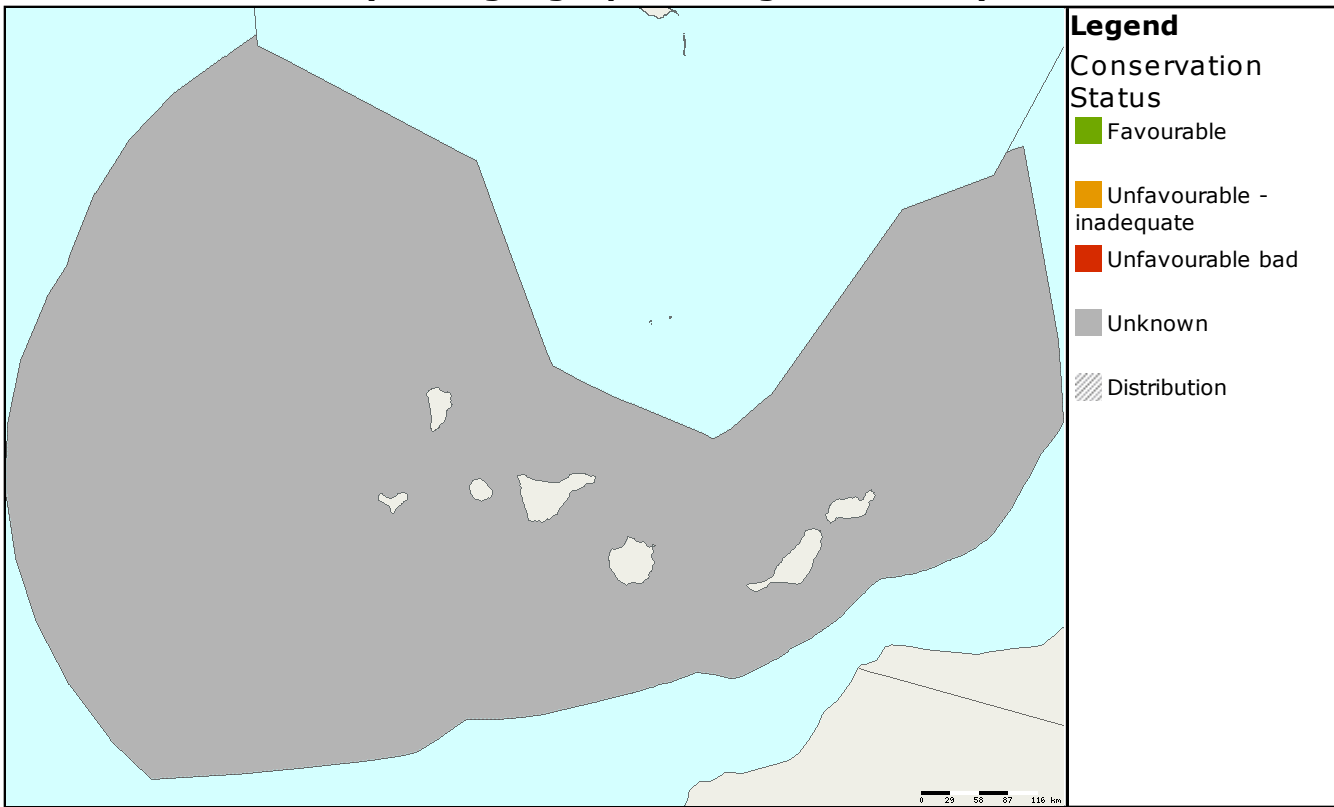

The Fraser's dolphin distribution is poorly known and hypothesized as occurring south of the 30°N latitude in the Atlantic ocean. The overall conservation status in the marine Macaronesian region is 'unknown' and based on the Spanish report of only one single animal stranding and two live sightings of the species recorded in the Canaries islands between 1990-2005. It is likely that this species should be considered an occasional species in Spanish Macaronesian waters unless otherwise proven differently in the future. The species is listed as 'least concern' in the IUCN Red List of threatened species.
