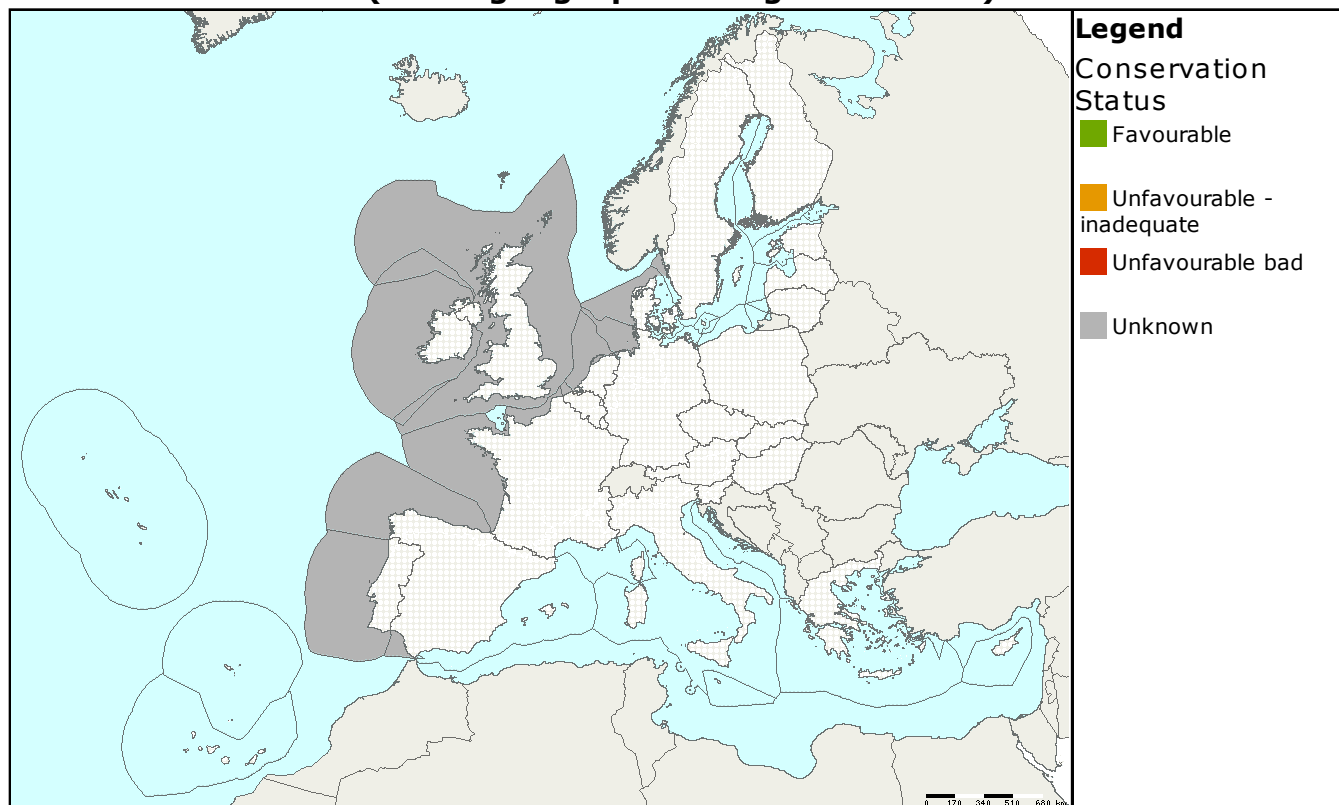

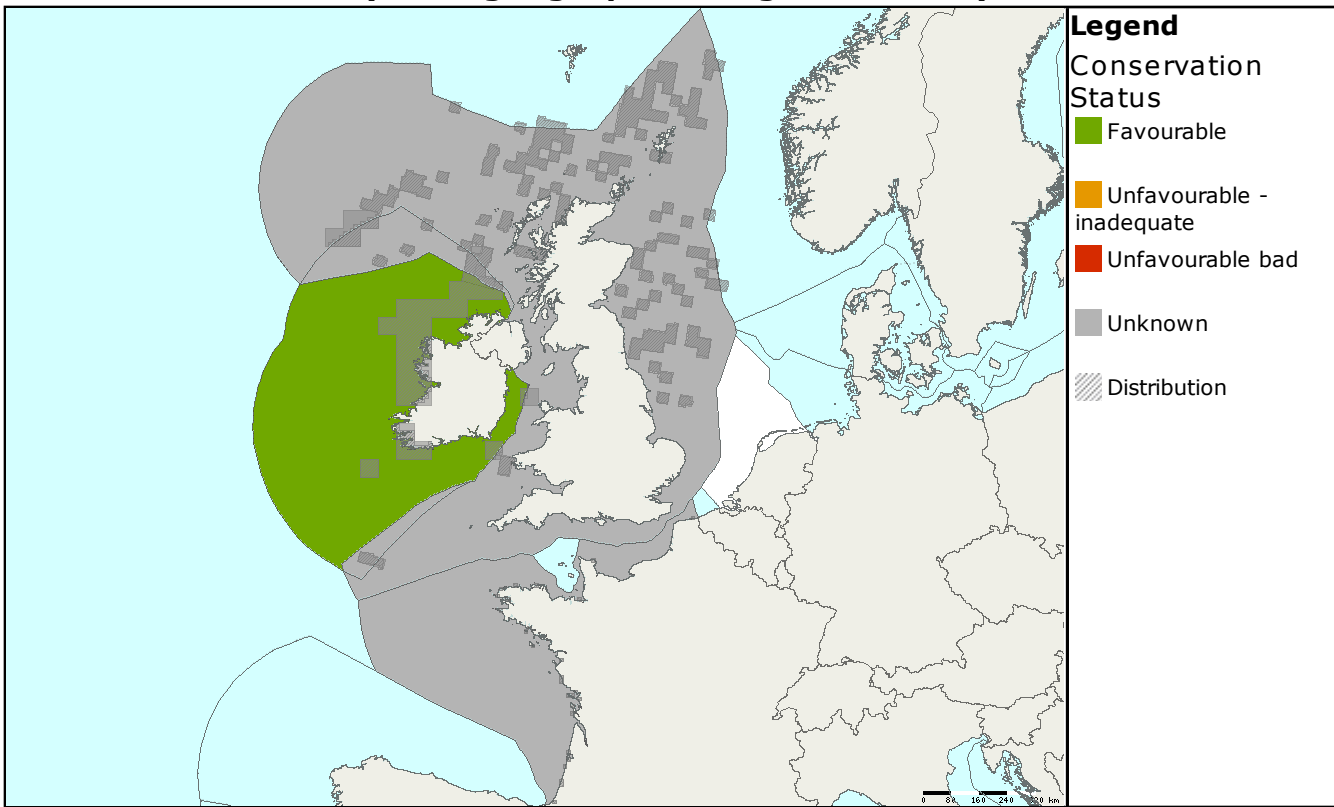

The Atlantic white-sided dolphin inhabits the cold temperate to subpolar waters of the continental slope and deeper waters of the marine Atlantic region from northwestern Ireland and the United Kingdom and southwards until the French coast of Brittany. The species is rare in the Channel, the North Sea and the Kattegat and Skagerrak seas. The overall assessment in the marine Atlantic region is 'unknown' due to the conclusions obtained for Population and Future prospects parameters. The species is believed to be abundant throughout its global range and is listed as a species of 'least concern' in the IUCN Red List of threatened species.
