



Sowerby's beaked whale inhabits the deep waters (more than 1,000 meters depth) of the North Atlantic. Its distribution records are mostly from areas north of the 30°N latitude and very little other information is available concerning its distribution and abundance. It has been observed north and west of the UK and Ireland, in the North Sea, in the western approach to the English Channel and the Bay of Biscay, as well as in the Azores and Madeira. The species is vulnerable to acoustic pollution such as that generated by military and seismic activities and various other forms of pollution.

The overall assessment in the marine Atlantic and Macaronesian regions is 'unknown' and based only on the respective Irish and Portuguese reports for which most parameter data is not available. This conservation status reflects the species' 'data deficient' listing in the IUCN's Red List of threatened species.
