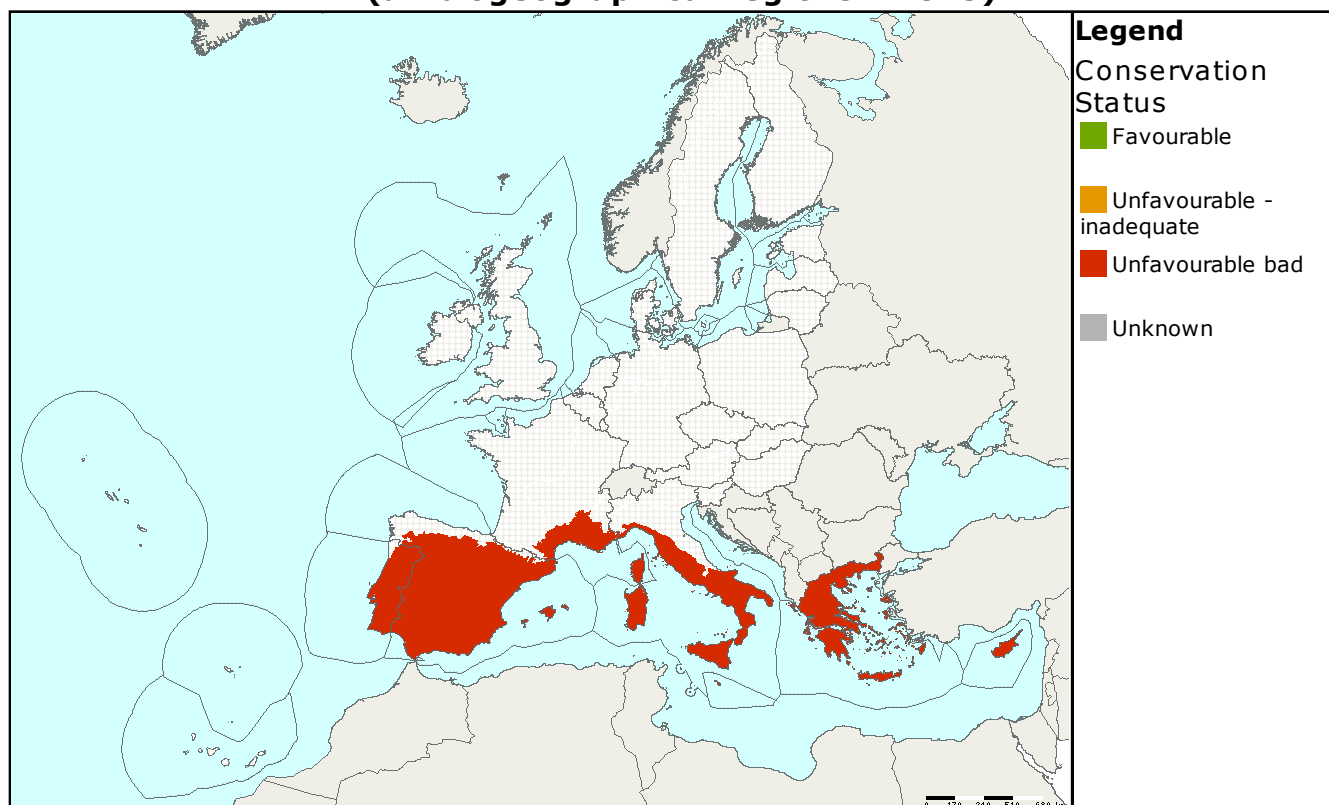

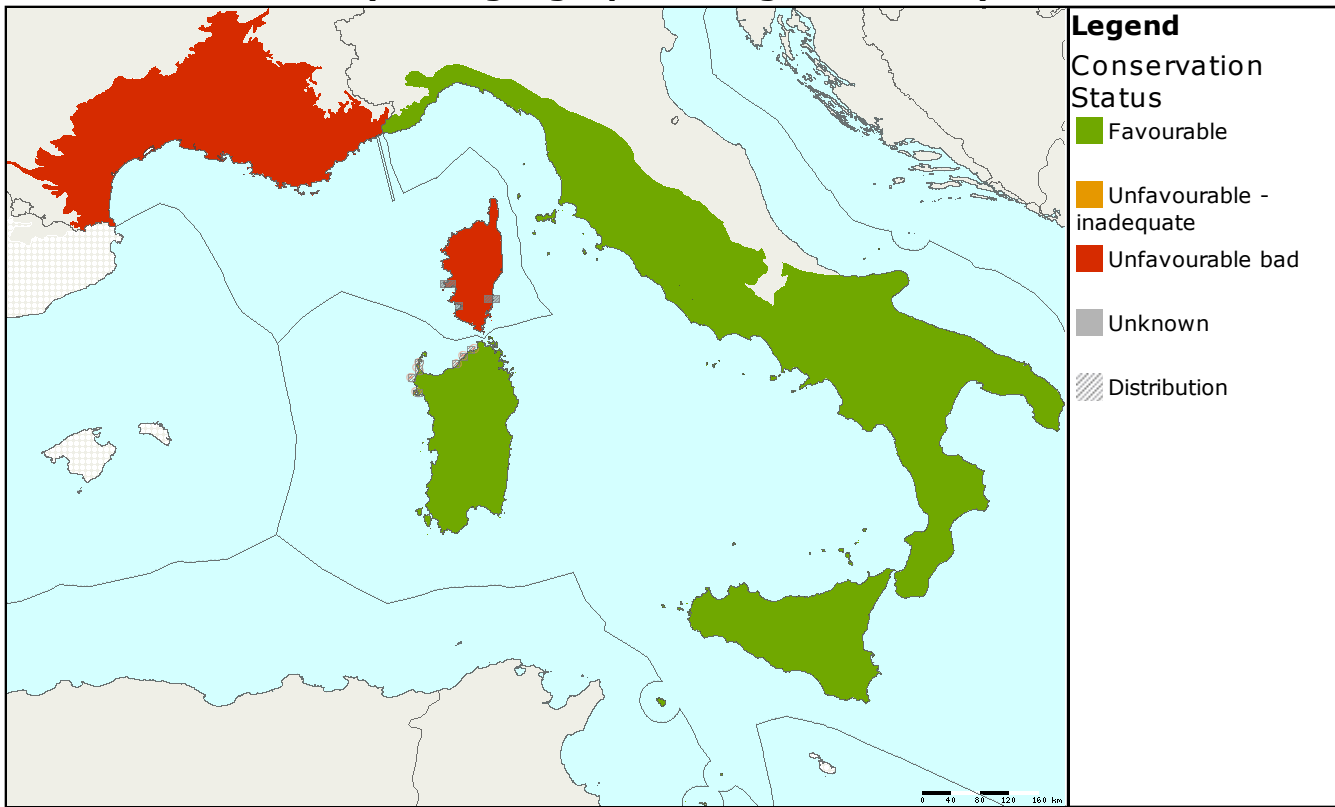

*Anchusa crispa* is a flowering plant species only found on the upper part of beaches on the islands of Corsica (France) and Sardinia (Italy). Species includes two subspecies: *A. crispa* ssp *crispa* and *A. crispa* ssp *maritima* - the second only known from Sardinia. Italy reports more localities (58.8%), however the overall conclusion is 'unfavourable-bad' due to French population, habitat and future prospects representing more than 25% of localities. Other parameters (especially range) are mostly in 'favourable' status. Species is assessed as 'critically endangered' on the IUCN Red List.
