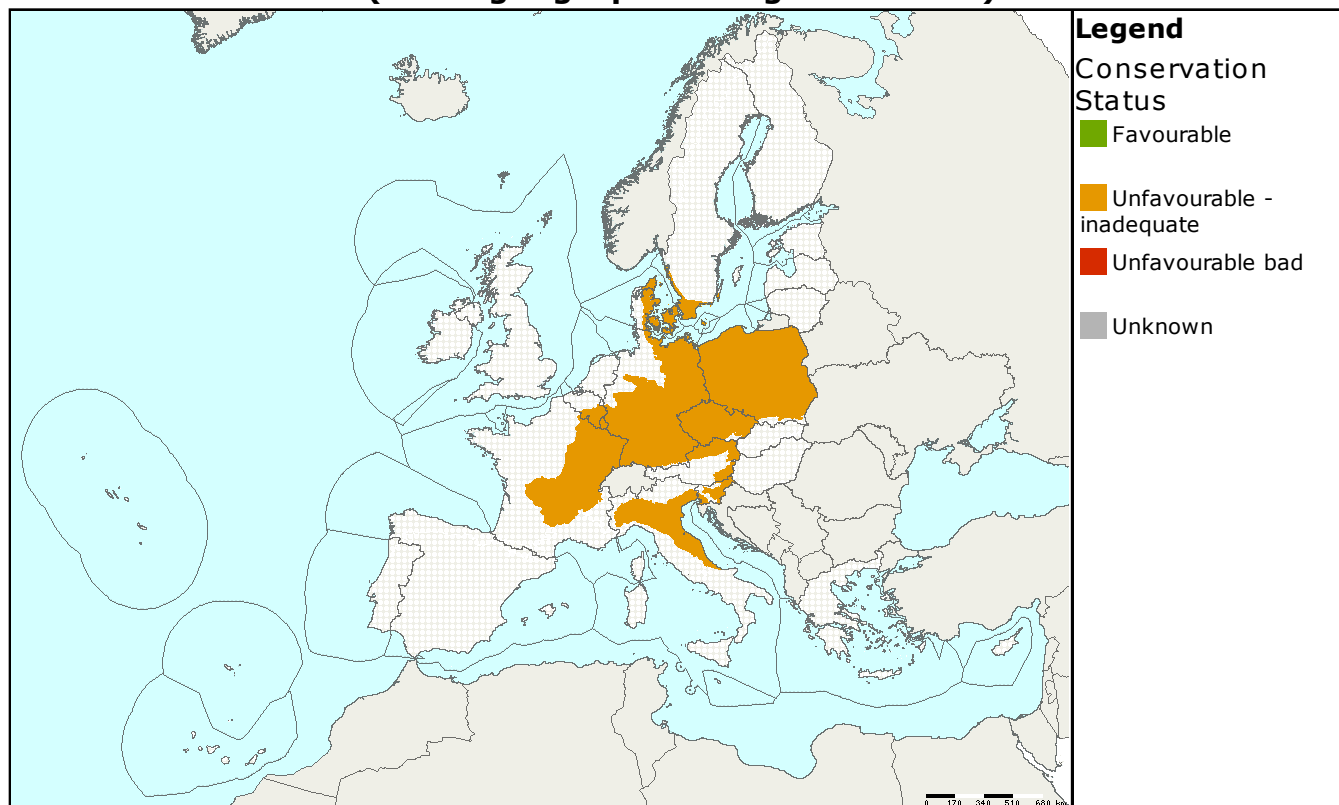

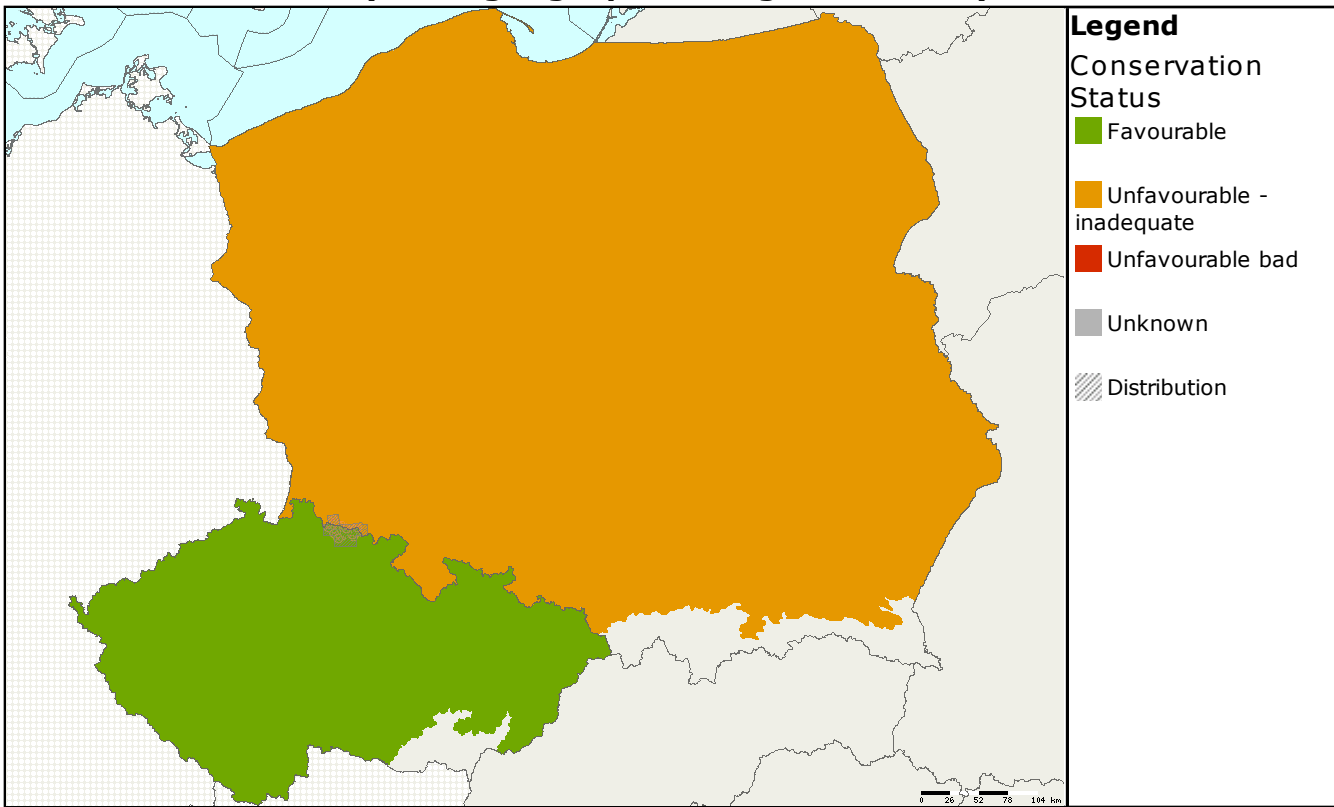

The Bohemian bellflower is endemic species with restricted distribution to a single mountain range on the border of Czech Republic and Poland (Krkonoše Mountains) in mountain and sub-alpine zone (Continental biogeographic region). The only 'unfavourable-inadequate' parameter is the habitat status in Poland. However, with the population of more than 50% in whole region, it turns the rest of all 'favourable' parameters in both countries (range, population and future prospects) to the conclusion of 'unfavourable-inadequate'.
