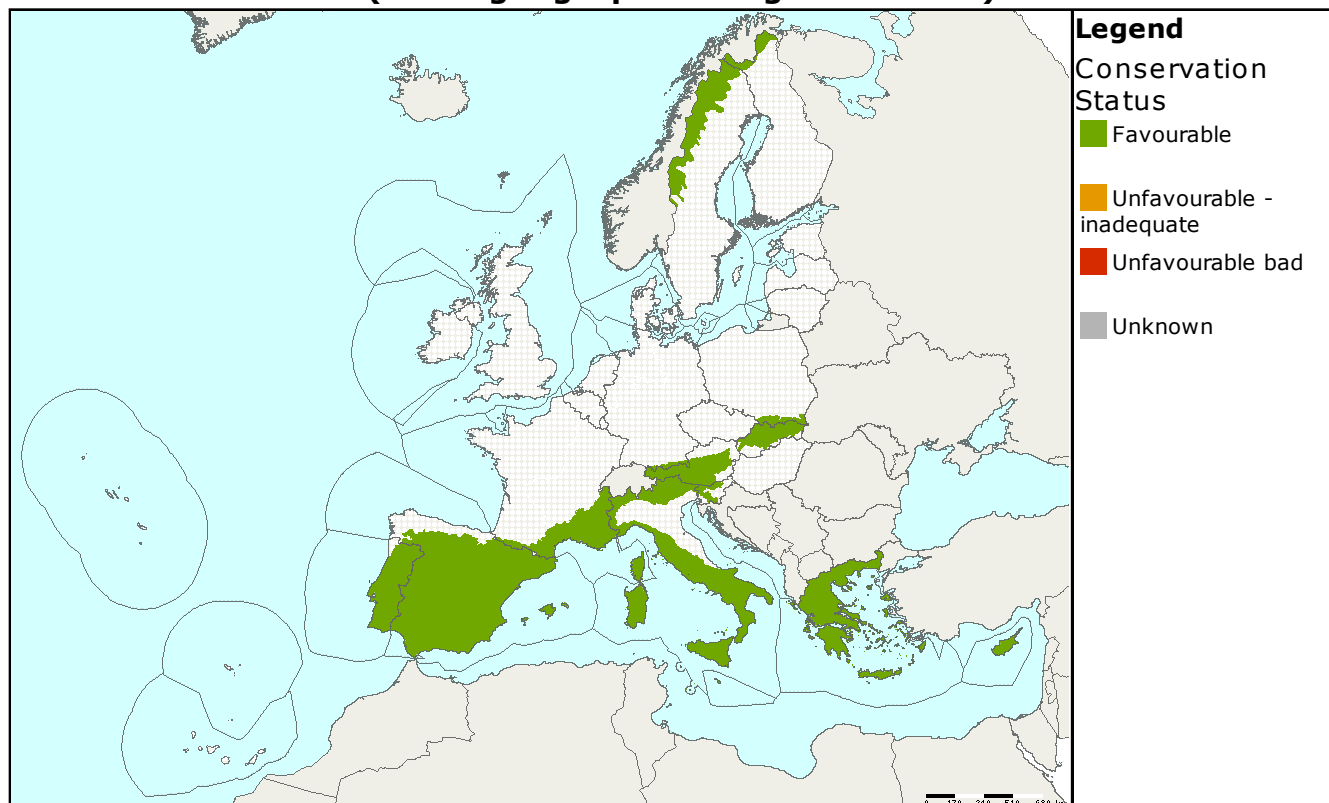

Savona Hare-bell is a plant species endemic to western Liguria. This species occurs on calcareous cliffs and scree, mainly in the vegetation zone of Mediterranean garrigue, and it is known from 3 localities in the Alpine biogeographical region and from 20 in the Mediterranean.

The conservation status in both biogeographical regions is 'favourable' population size and range are stable and sufficient to ensure long-term viability of the species. The species is listed in the Italian Red list under the category 'least concern' although recently it would rather be classified as vulnerable. Its habitat is under the pressure of the development of the infrastructure.
