



The drooping wood reed (Cinna latifolia) is a perennial plan occurring in Boreal biogeographical region of Europe, mostly in Finland and Sweden. It is also quite common in North America. It grows in moist woods, meadows and stream banks. Overall conclusion for its conservation status is 'unfavourable-inadequate' due to such status in all of the country reports (Finland, Sweden, Estonia and Latvia). Only the range is reported 'favourable' from all countries.
