



A moss species occurring in the Northern Europe. It is known from Norway, Sweden, Finland and Russia. It grows on shaded siliceous rocks and cliffs and on humid stands in undergrowth of coniferous forests.

The conservation status in the Alpine biogeographical region, where the species occurs mainly in Sweden is 'favourable'. In the Boreal biogeographical region the species is in 'unfavourable inadequate' conservation status. The population size is not sufficient to ensure a long-term viability and the area of habitat is decreasing. Species is threatened by inappropriate forestry practices. It is listed in the European Red List of Bryophytes in the category 'near threatened'.
