



The *Dichelyma capillaceum* is a moss species which occurs in several European countries.

In the Atlantic region the occurrence of this species is limited to small areas. The overall assessment is 'inadequate'. In the Boreal region it was assessed as 'favourable'. Of all countries Sweden is by far the most important country in terms of suitable habitat. In Sweden this species has a 'favourable' status. In the Continental region it is assessed as 'bad', mainly due to the Polish assessment (where it probably has become extinct).
