



Echinodium spinosum is a moss endemic to La Palma (Spain) and Madeira (Portugal). It is assessed as 'favourable' for Macaronesian region although there is relatively little information from Spain and 'unknown' may be more accurate assessment. It is classified as 'critically endangered' in 'Libro Rojo de la Flora Canaria contenida en la Directiva-Hábitats Europea' (1999) and 'endangered' in Red data book of European Bryophytes.
