



A plant species endemic to the Iberian Peninsula. It occurs on calcareous rocky slopes in the mountainous regions of Northern Portugal and Western Spain in various types of xerophilous habitats like grassland, forest margins, light oak forest and or shrub formations.

The conservation status in both the Atlantic and the Mediterranean biogeographical region is 'unknown'. The reports for this in general poorly known species are incomplete. Better information is required to allow the assessment of conservation status at the biogeographical level. The species is not considered particularly endangered in any of the countries.
