



Hippuris tetraphylla is a perennial aquatic plant with circumpolar distribution. Only found along coasts of the gulf of Bosnia within the EU (Boreal region), but also in Russia and North American Arctic. Historically the species had a much larger distribution, occurring along most of the Finnish coast. Pressures include eutrophication of the sea resulting in increased growth of other species. It is listed as 'critically endangered' in Swedish Red Data Book. Its conservation status is assessed as 'unfavourable-inadequate'. Action required if the species is to survive!
