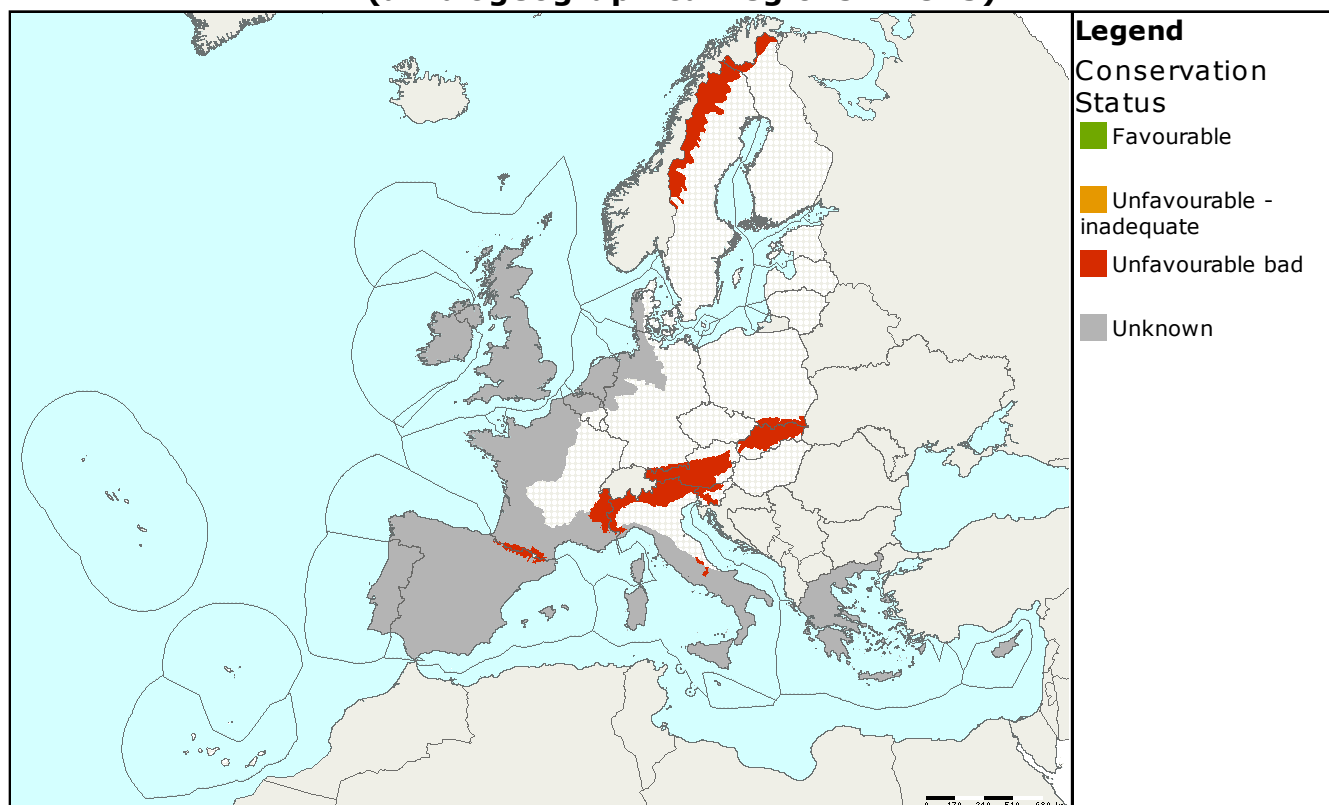

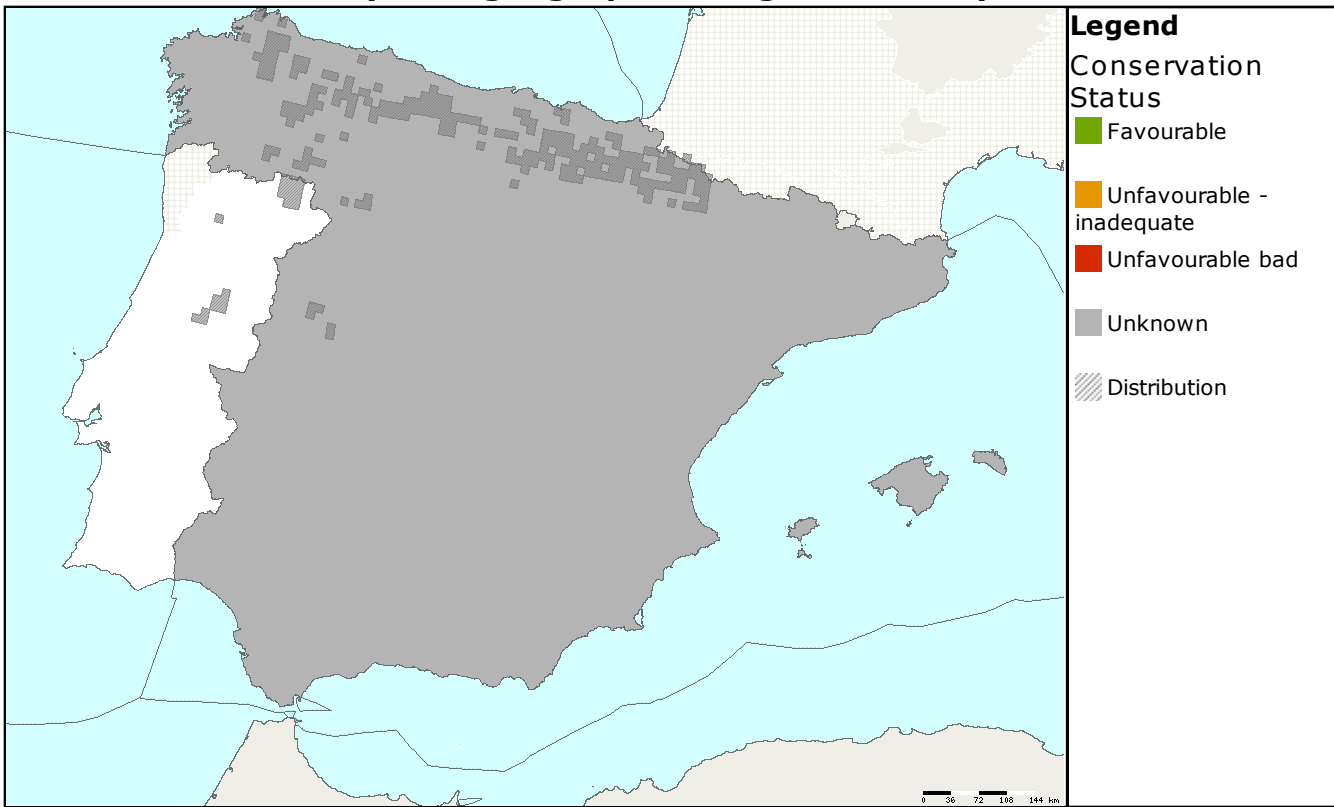

The *Narcissus asturiensis* is a small daffodil species which grows in central and north-eastern parts of the Iberian Peninsula.

The status of this species is poorly known. It has been assessed as ‘unknown’ in the Atlantic and the Mediterranean region, which together compile the largest part of this species’ range. In the less important Alpine region its status was assessed as ‘bad’, due to the ‘bad but improving’ future prospects in Spain. More data are required to improve the overall assessment.
