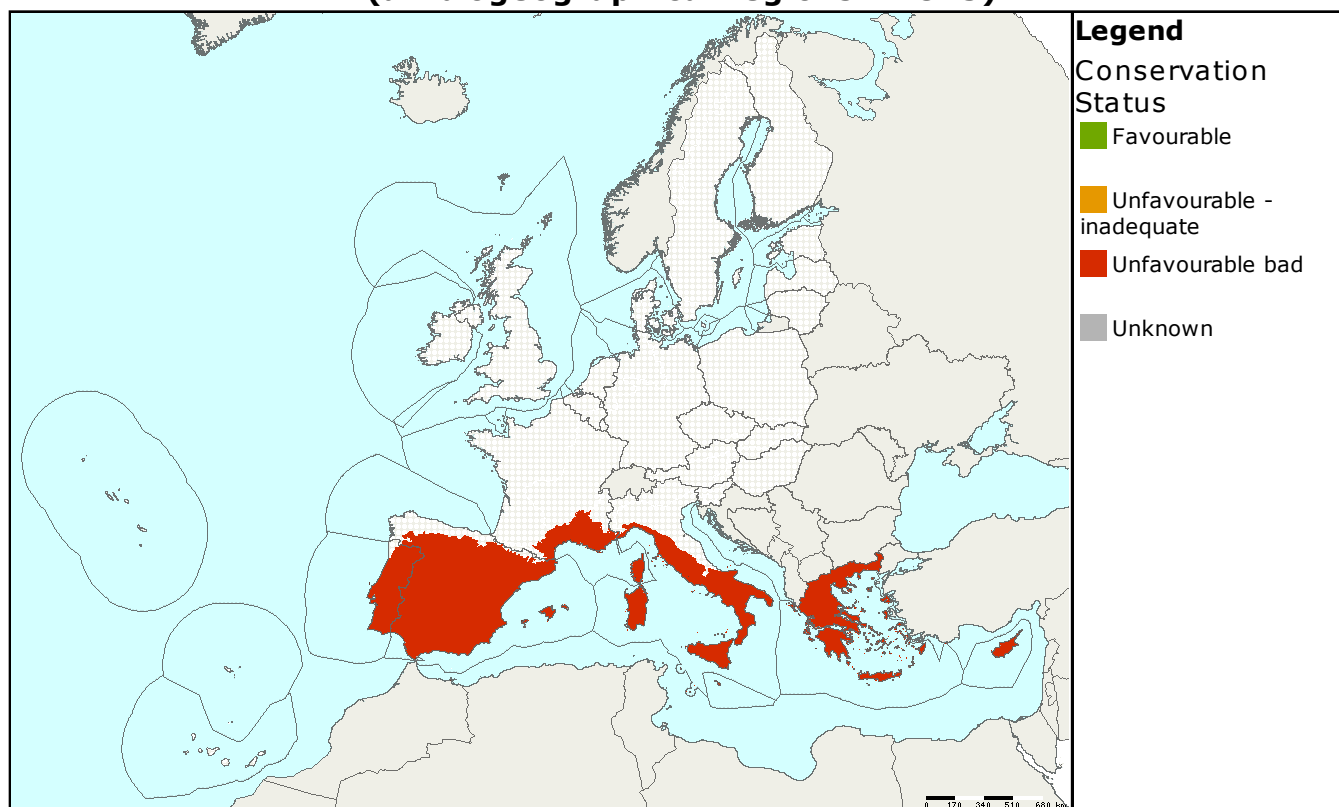

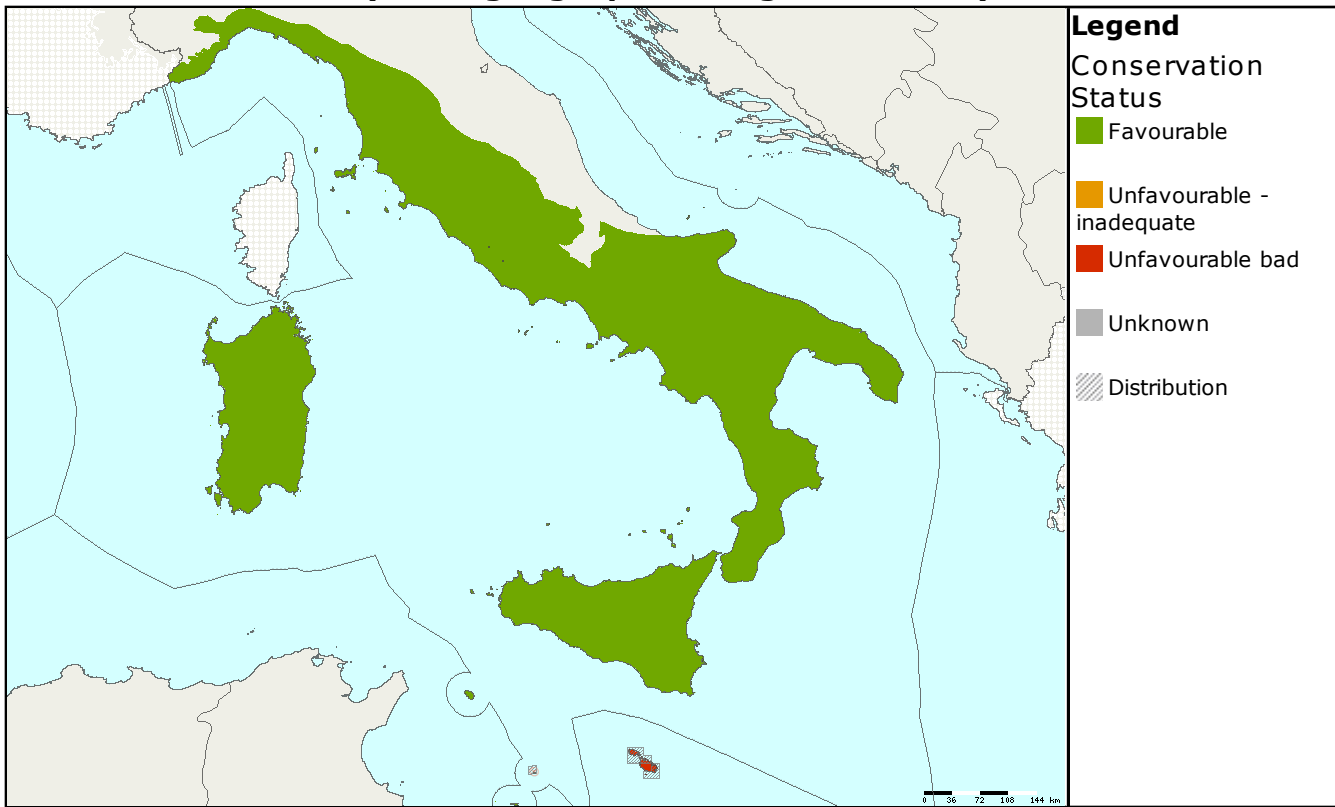

The Maltese toadflax (*Linaria pseudolaxiflora*) is a sub-endemic plant species mostly found on the Maltese islands, but also present in Linosa (Sicily, Italy). It grows in rocky and stony arid places such as garigues, cliffs and walls. In Malta it is difficult to establish the future prospects due to differing population numbers and its sporadic nature, but the species is probably viable in the long-term, particularly in less vulnerable areas in the coastal cliffs region. However, overall assessment is 'unfavourable-bad' based on report from Malta that is rather negative.
