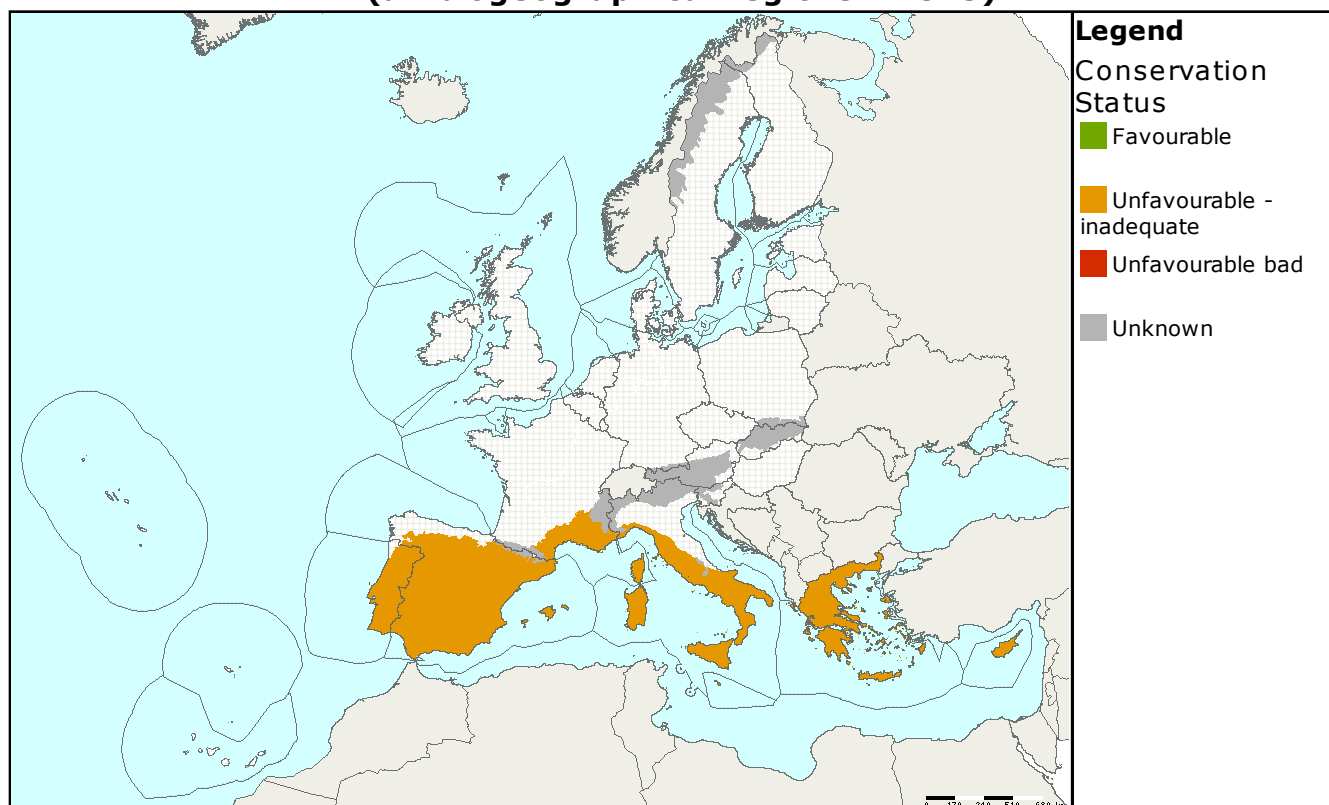

Assessments of conservation status at the European level (all biogeographical regions - EU25)



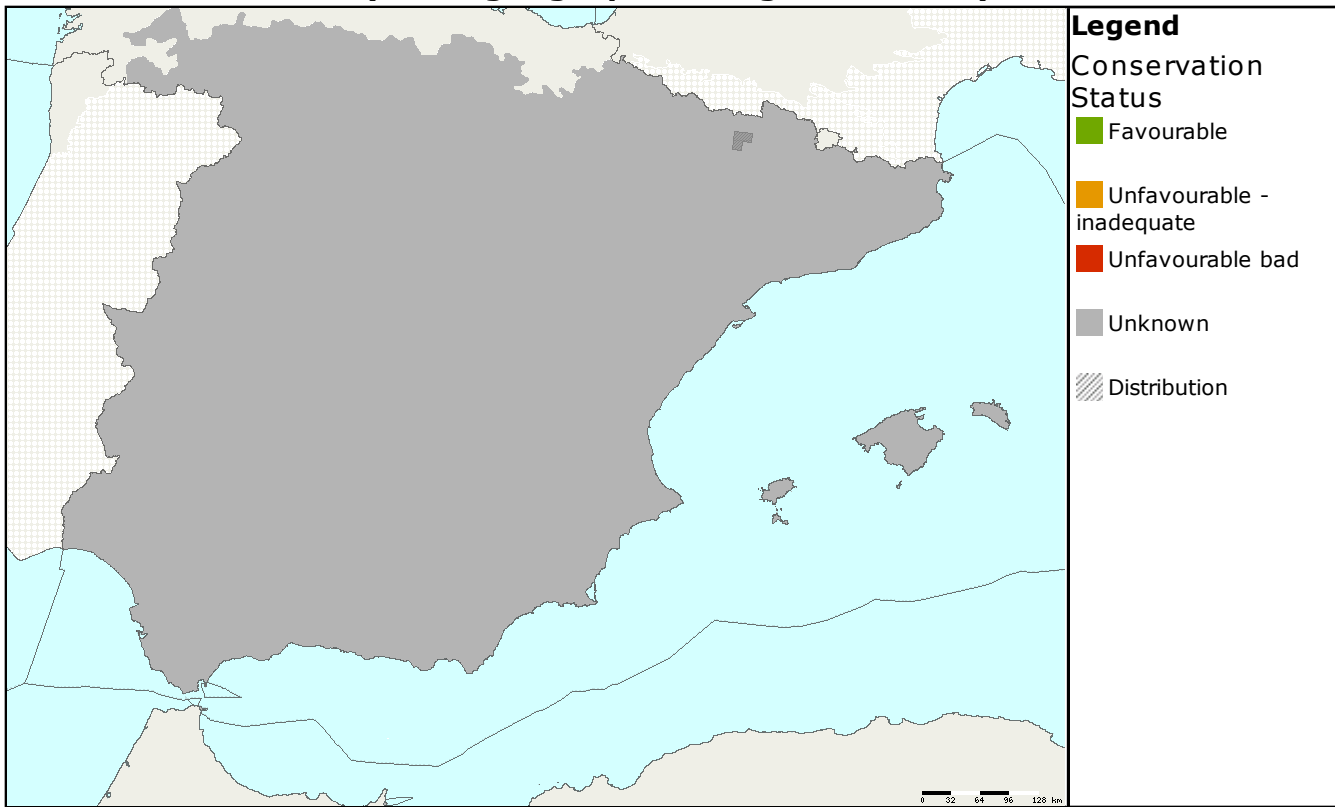

A plant species endemic to a single valley in Aragon in Spain on the boundary between the Alpine and Mediterranean biogeographical regions. It is found in both biogeographical regions. It grows on shaded limestone cliffs and overhangs in deep gorges.

The conservation status is 'unknown' in the Alpine biogeographical region and was reported as 'unknown' as well in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The future prospect in the Mediterranean biogeographical region are poor, which leads to the 'unfavourable inadequate' biogeographical assessment.

The reports for this in general poorly known species provided by Spain are incomplete. Better information is required to allow comprehensive assessment of conservation status.
