



This shrub occurs mainly in the mountainous regions around the Black Sea, the centre of the distribution spreads over the mountains of Anatolia and Caucasus. The localities in Belarus, Ukraine, Greece and Slovenia are in marginal position. The site in Poland represents a distant isolated occurrence of the species. In the centre of its distribution this species of rhododendron grows in high mountain coniferous forests on oligotrophic stands. In the Continental biogeographical region it is a species of open forests, often on sandy or peaty or other oligotrophic substrates.

The conservation status in the Continental biogeographical region is 'unfavourable inadequate' which is largely due to the status of isolated population in Poland. Although no negative changes in the range and

population were recorded here in last decades, to restore the favourable conservation status it is necessary to establish a supplementary artificial population. This is the reason, why both parameters were assessed as 'unfavourable inadequate'. The conservation status in the Mediterranean biogeographical region is unknown; the reports provided for this species are incomplete. Better information is required.
