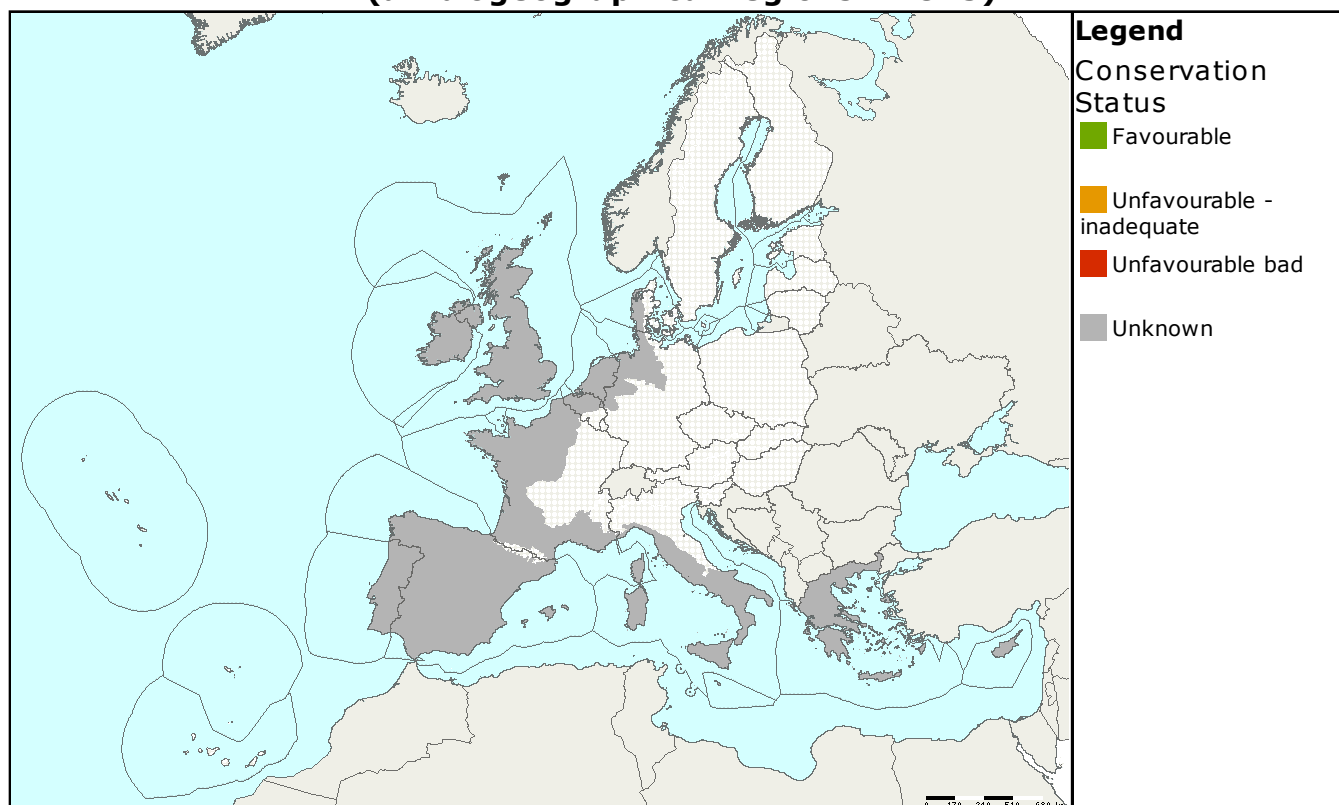

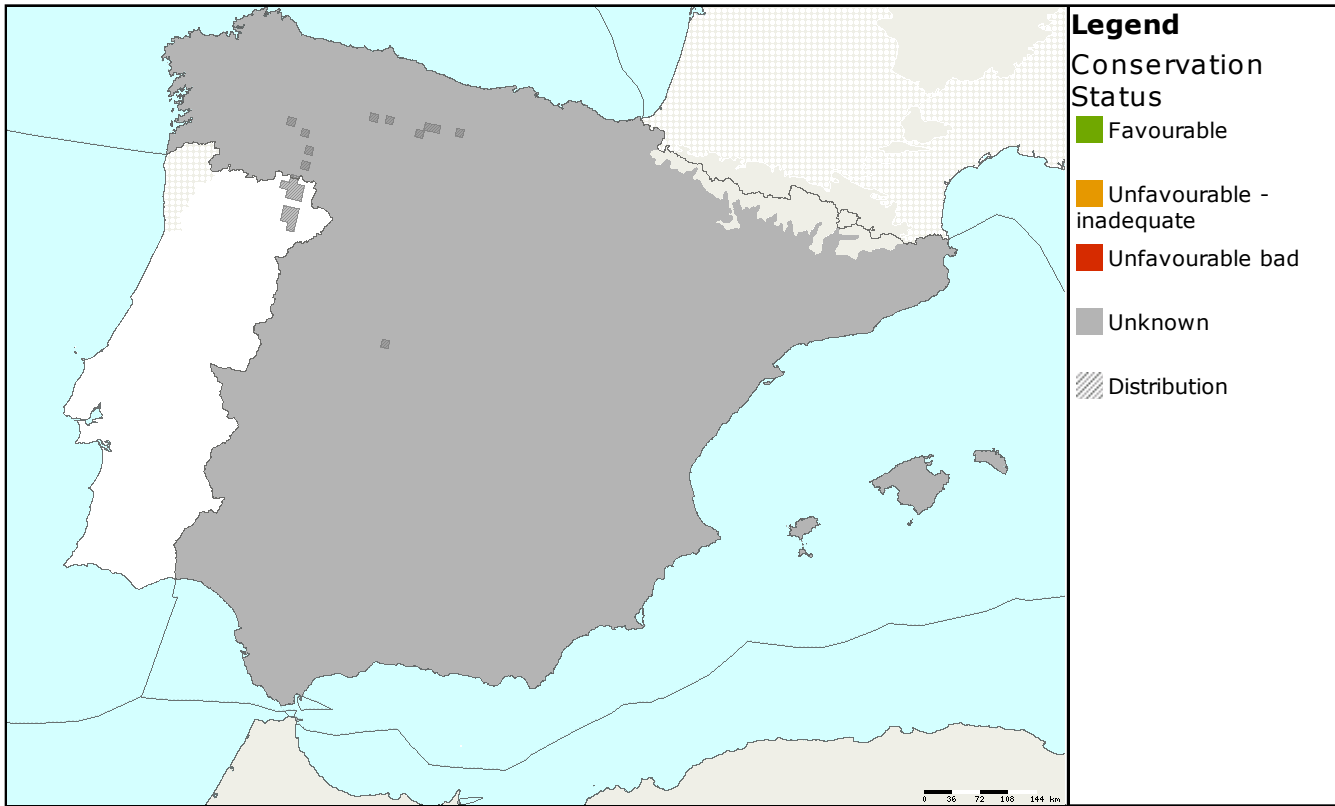

A plant species endemic to the north-western part of the Iberian Peninsula. It is relatively common, although with restricted range, in northern Portugal and it occurs as well in north-western Spain. It grows on the outcrops of ultra-basic rocks, rarely it can be found on basic substrates. It prefers open vegetation.

The conservation status in both the Mediterranean and the Continental biogeographical regions is 'unknown'. The reports provided are incomplete. Better information is required to allow comprehensive biogeographical assessment. The species is considered vulnerable in Portugal, which is mainly due to the restricted natural range. In both countries the habitats of the species is under the pressure of human activities, like open cast mining and

development of infrastructure.
