



A plant species endemic to the North-Western Iberian peninsula. It occurs in several localities in Spain and Portugal. It is a woodland species preferring young forests.

The conservation status is 'unfavourable inadequate' in the Atlantic and the Mediterranean biogeographical regions. Although the reports for this in general very poorly known species are incomplete and the conservation status is unknown or was not assessed, based on the information on Future prospect of the species in Portugal it is possible to conclude, that the conservation status is 'unfavourable inadequate'. Better information on the status of the species and potential pressures and threats is required.
