



This species occurs along the Atlantic coast of south-western Europe. It is known from several localities in France, Spain and Portugal. It is a species of pioneer amphibian plant communities of oligotrophic, exceptionally slightly brackish waters. It grows in shallow lakes and depressions on a sand substrate.

The conservation status in the Atlantic biogeographical region, where species occurs only in France is 'unfavourable inadequate'. From a long-term perspective the species is on the decline. The pioneer habitats of the species are dependent on the traditional agricultural practises and the abandonment of those leads to the fast succession of other vegetation types. On top of that, the suitable habitats are being lost due to development activities in the

coastal regions. The conservation status in the Mediterranean biogeographical region is 'unknown' and the reports provided by both countries are incomplete. The pressures on the habitat are similar to those in the Atlantic biogeographical region. It is included in the national red lists in Portugal and France under the category 'vulnerable'.
